ART MATERIALS MONEY

We've collected €4,911 so far with €900 due to come in. Our projected expenditure for photocopying expenses for the year is €1,600. This includes rental, clicks and paper. We've spent €477 on whiteboards and A4 clear boards to cut down on paper use. These resources can no longer be shared among classrooms so we may need more. We've bought online subscriptions for some digital resources e.g. oral language programme etc. €280 with this money also. We have bought/will buy copies for class use and the usual art supplies with the remainder. Last year we used the materials money to subscribe to SESE Explorers, DabbleDoo Music and Twinkl. We received no reimbursement due to closing in March. We will have to subscribe to SeeSaw if we go into lockdown again. Thank you for getting the money in to us as we are busy spending it!

DIGITAL LEARNING

The Department of Education and Skills issued an Information Communication Technology (ICT) grant to schools to enable them to provide remote learning last May. We did not receive this grant as our school opened after 2016. I have asked the Educate Together office to advocate for us in attaining this grant like other schools. I have also brought this to the attention of our district inspector. We will be spending minor works money on purchasing laptops for teachers in the interim.

ACCOMMODATION FOR NEXT YEAR

Discussion and dialogue is ongoing regarding our accommodation needs for next year. Our planning permission for Marsh House runs out in November 2021. Of course it is the Department of Education and Skills who fund refurbishments and building projects so it is understandable that they are investigating all possibilities. We have no new news this week other than there are conversations and correspondence between our patron and the Department of Education which is positive. The Board of Management will update parents as soon as we hear more and there will be a monthly update in newsletters. As things in school are very busy with teaching, learning and new Covid measures Miriam/Sarah will be focusing on all things other than accommodation for the next few months. We have set up a separate email CETNSbuildingproject2021@gmail.com to allow parents communicate directly with the Board of Management if desired in relation to accommodation. The Board of Management wrote to the Department of Education last Friday pushing for a response.

EDUCATE TOGETHER MEMBERSHIP

The Department of Education and Skills grant €15,000 for opening a new school. This is inadequate and the average cost of opening a school is €62,000. Your €15 contribution to Educate Together allows Educate Together continue to develop the "Learn Together" curriculum, open new schools, advocate for equality in education so that no child will be an outsider and they provide school supports to existing schools.

This year so far for example the Educate Together office have sent lessons on talking to children about anxiety, they have approved our Admissions Policy and they are liaising with the Department of Education and Skills regarding our accommodation for next year. If there is a positive test result

On Friday 25th September we received an update from the Department of Education and Skills and our patron. We have been asked to share this in our newsletter. "If your child is confirmed positive for Covid-19, the HSE will begin the process of contact tracing. This will most likely mean that the school will be contacted to assess the Public Health Risk. **From this point onwards, the process will be led by the Public Health HSE.**" It is the HSE and not the school Principal or Board of Management who decide if pod/class or school should close.
