No two children will have the same spellings, as no two children are the same. *Spellings for Me* incorporates meaningful, enjoyable activities for your child that are proven to improve children's spellings. *Spellings for Me* embraces continuous learning and continuous assessment throughout your child's whole spelling journey through primary school. STANDARDISED TESTING IN ENGLISH AND MATHS

The Department of Education has decided that these should proceed for the year ahead. This decision is somewhat at odds with the focus that we have put upon easing children back in to school life, particularly given that the tests used are standardised against a pupil population from 2019 – before the upheaval in school and home life that we've all coped with in the past two years. The standardised score that children receive this year cannot possibly be compared to that of two years ago, and will not be reflective of their effort, resilience, achievement and hard work this year more than any other. The outcome of the testing this year will provide a snapshot, a starting point, from which we will measure progress over the next year. We will conduct Standardised English and Maths tests in First- Third Class.
