IF SICK STAY AT HOME

As always, we remind parents to keep sick children at home. As we enter into the winter season, the usual respiratory infections become an important concern. SENSITIVE RSE LESSONS

We will be teaching sensitive Relationship and Sexuality Lessons in January. Parents have a right to request that their children be removed from such lessons if you would prefer to teach them yourself. "The talk" which is still used by some schools has been mostly been phased out and the children learn about the sexual reproductive system over a series of lessons, delivered by a teacher in the school. This is making the big talk many small talks and allows children time to process this new information. We have booklets from the HSE which we will be available to parents during these lessons. Parents of 5th class pupils may wish to review the content of sensitive lessons.

TIME TO READ PROGRAMME

We are working with Mayo County Library and the Time to Read coordinator Fania Ellison to establish a reading programme to support pupils. Time to Read is a reading support programme for children in 2nd class where company volunteers come into the school, once a week, for 16 weeks, and help the children with their reading. WINTER FESTIVALS

As the festive season approaches, we will be learning about a range of festivals. Hopefully your children will be telling you about Thanksgiving, Kwanzaa, Hannukah, Christmas and Ōmisoka. Learning about festivals is part of Belief Systems in our Learn Together Curriculum. Each year we draw up our learn together themes and ensure there is a balanced approach to teaching about Belief Systems. In 2019 for example the children learned that Christians believe that Jesus was born, in 2020 we had a guest speaker who talked to Senior Classes about growing up in the Jewish Faith and the celebration of Hannukah. In selecting our Learn Together themes each year we have focused on a belief system-Buddhism was the focus of last year. This year our focus in on changemakers and people who make a difference. The children will be learning about Frida Kahlo, Rachel Blackmore and others who have overcome difficulties. Stevie Wonder also features and he is Sarah's all-time favourite artist and like some of our pupils is blind/visually impaired.

PERMANENT POSITION FOR PAUL

Congratulation to Paul Gannon our 5th class teacher who is now a permanent member of staff. Our enrolment numbers 116 on September 30th mean that we now have 6 permanent members of teaching staff- Sarah, Miriam, Liam, Brenda, Declan and Paul. We would need approximately 146 pupils enrolled for our next permanent post. Unfortunately, we have no physical space for additional pupils this year in Marsh House so our BOM are working to increase capacity for next year.

BOOK FAIR

Thanks to all who supported or volunteered at our recent book fair. The children enjoyed having this new range of books in our school and it has motivated them to continue to read. The love of reading is alive and well.

SCHOOL INSPECTOR

Our school inspector for this year is Martin Whyte-Divisional Inspector. Last year we had a curriculum evaluation in the teaching of English and this year we expect to have an incidental inspection or another curriculum evaluation in a different subject. All developing schools are given visits each year to monitor progress as they grow and develop.

IRISH PRIMARY PRINCIPAL'S NETWORK (IPPN)

The Irish Primary Principals' Network (IPPN) is the professional body for Irish primary school leaders. It was established in the year 2000 to address school leaders' professional and personal needs. Annually they hold a conference and Sarah will be attending this year from Wednesday 16th-Friday 18th November. Miriam is the acting designated liaison person for any child protection concerns in Sarah's absence.

WHOLE SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

On Friday December 16th our whole school (both locations) will be coming together for a whole school assembly. We will be using the Linenhall Arts Centre to discuss all our achievements for the first term of school. This special assembly will give the children an opportunity to see everyone in the school together in one place. We will sing songs and do shining stars together on this day. We are looking forward to this great occasion.

SPELLINGS FOR ME SURVEY

As part of our school self-evaluation (SSE) we are focusing on the way we teach and the children learn spellings. Each child from 1st class has a personalised spelling list instead of the usual one size fits all lists of the past. We use a programme called spellings for me. Staff have spent time on professional development upskilling in this new way of teaching spellings and there has been a significant investment of time in testing pupils. We would like to survey parents to ascertain your views on the effectiveness of this programme. This will inform our teaching going forward. CODING

Classes 1st-5th attended a coding workshop in Castlebar Library on Monday November 14th. The workshop was run by Corrib Kids Coding for Science Week 2022. 1st to 4th used Scratch and 5th used Microsoft MakeCode Arcade to designed their own games.
